KINGS LAFCO PUBLIC MEETING PROTOCOL IN RESPONSE TO CORONAVIRUS COVID-19

California Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-29-20 on March 12, 2020 and March 17, 2020, respectively, relating to the convening of public agency meetings in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Kings LAFCO hereby provides notice that it will convene a regular meeting by teleconference going forward, and will close its Board Chambers to the public generally, except as described below, until further notice.

Pursuant to the Executive Orders, and to maintain the orderly conduct of the meeting, Kings LAFCO will allow the Commission, staff and interested members of the public to attend the meeting telephonically or by the Internet, and to participate in the meeting to the same extent as if they were present in the Board Chambers. SUBJECT: 2021-2022 Proposed Budget

I. INTRODUCTION:

The Executive Officer's proposed Fiscal Year 2021-2022 LAFCO Budget is provided for the Commission's consideration and adoption. This proposed budget was first presented to the Commission as a Preliminary Budget review on March 24, 2021, and presented as the Proposed Budget with the first public hearing on May 12, 2021. This proposed budget of \$76,140 is \$455 more than last year's request, and represents a 0.60% increase. The requested amount covers LAFCO's general activities as required by Assembly Bill 2838, the Cortese - Knox - Hertzberg Act, and continued involvement with CALAFCO to keep current on legislative and procedural changes. The largest adjustments in the budget this year are an increase of \$690 in publications and legal notices and increases of \$994 in administrative allocation. The net result of all of the budget changes resulted in the budget with an increase of \$455. projected at \$40,320, up \$977 from the 2020-2021 Budget. This amount includes the estimated LAFCO Application Fees of \$4,500 and City shares for half of the remaining LAFCO budget. The County covers the remaining half of the LAFCO Budget share of \$35,820, which is a decrease of \$523 from last FY.

II. LAFCO 2021-2022 FISCAL YEAR OBJECTIVES

The primary objectives for the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year Budget will center on continued training for LAFCO staff on operational procedures and processes, timely processing of reorganization and extension of service applications, processing of all spheres of influence amendments for the cities, communities, and special districts in Kings County, and preparing resources for the next required update. Staff will also review and assist Cities and Districts with the preparation of detailed MSRs for any Sphere of Influence Amendment application submitted to LAFCO to ensure compliance with Government Code Section 56430. As LAFCO staff is often relied upon by Cities to advise their prospective development applicants on annexation processes, staff needs to remain current on LAFCO processes, procedures, issues and implementation strategies. Continuing Legislative changes to LAFCO processes and procedures also necessitates

staff's need for continual update through CALAFCO legislative review activities. LAFCO staff has remained actively involved with CALAFCO workshops and other training venues to fulfill that need. The two annual CALAFCO training events are organized by LAFCO volunteers to keep all LAFCOs current on issues and implementation strategies.

III. RECOMMENDATION:

The Executive Officer recommends that the Commission continue the public hearing to receive public comment and testimony on the proposed LAFCO Budget and consider adoption.

SUBJECT: LAFCO Public Alternate Member Vacancy

BACKGROUND

The LAFCO Commission for Kings County is made up of five Commissioners representing three categories (County, Cities, and Public) of appointment, with an additional Alternate Member for each category. Commissioners serve four-year terms. LAFCO Commissioners' terms expire on the first Monday in May of the fourth year of their respective term (Government Code Section 56334). An updated list of current Commission Member terms is attached as Exhibit A.

On March 1, 2021, LAFCO staff received the resignation of Vernon Costa (Public Member Alternate) whose term was set to expire on May this year. That leaves a current vacancy in the Public Member Alternate, which can be considered for appointment by the County and City members on the LAFCO Commission (Government Code Section 56325 (d)). The Public Member Alternate term would serve until May 2025. Certain restrictions apply for candidate eligibility for the Public Member and Alternate Commissioner seats (Government Code Section 56331).

In order to be eligible to serve as either a Public Member or Public Member Alternate, a candidate shall be a resident of Kings County, and not be an officer or employee of the County, City or District.

LAFCO staff has received one application for the Public Member Alternate from Martin Devine. Mr. Devine has previously served on this LAFCO Commission as a City Member representing the City of Hanford. Mr. Devine no longer serves on the City Council and meets all of the eligibility requirements to serve as the Public Member Alternate. His application requesting to serve as the Public Member Alternate is attached as Exhibit B.

RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer recommends that the LAFCO Commission consider appointing Martin Devine to the Public Member Alternate position.
